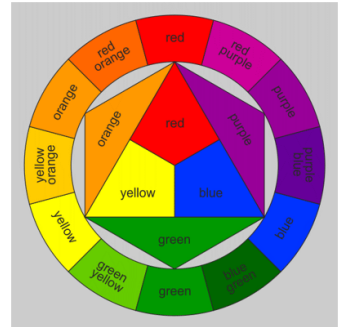
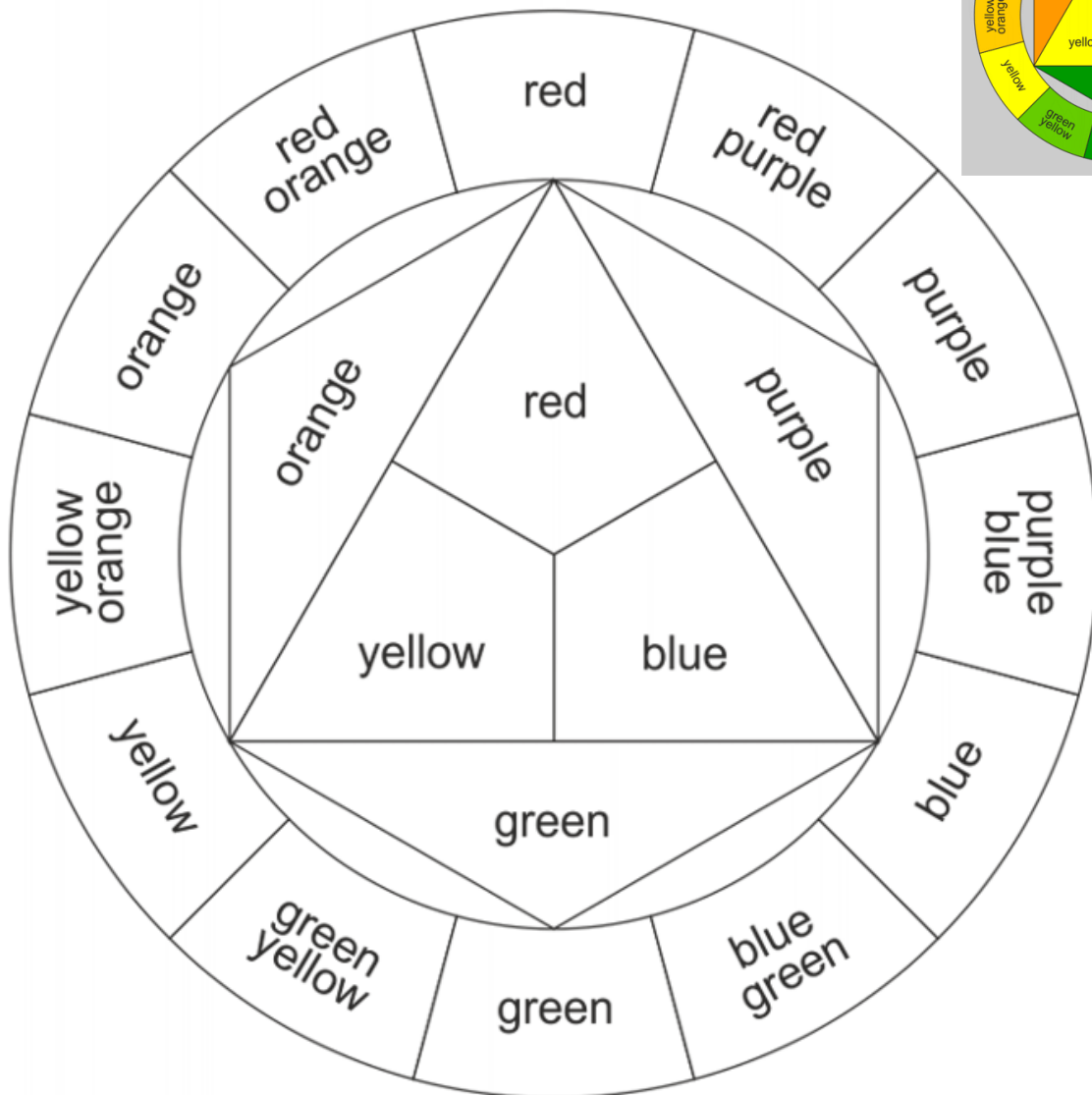
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Produce a twelve-section colour wheel. Colour this wheel or use this as a template to create your own using a compass and a ruler

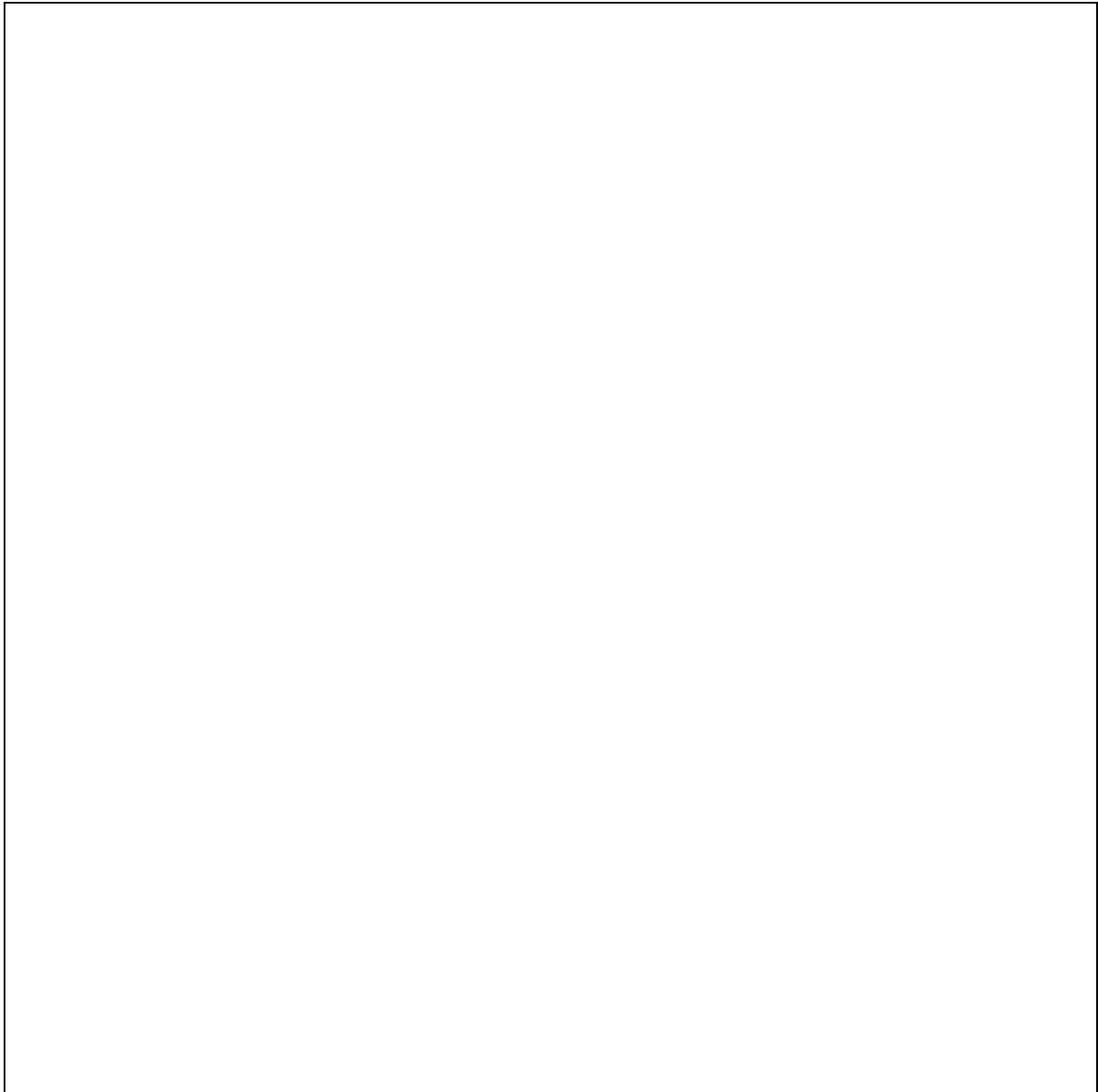

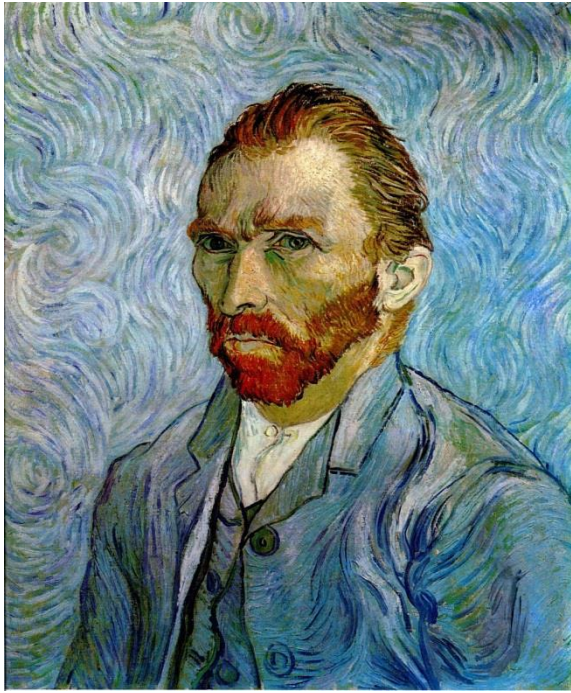

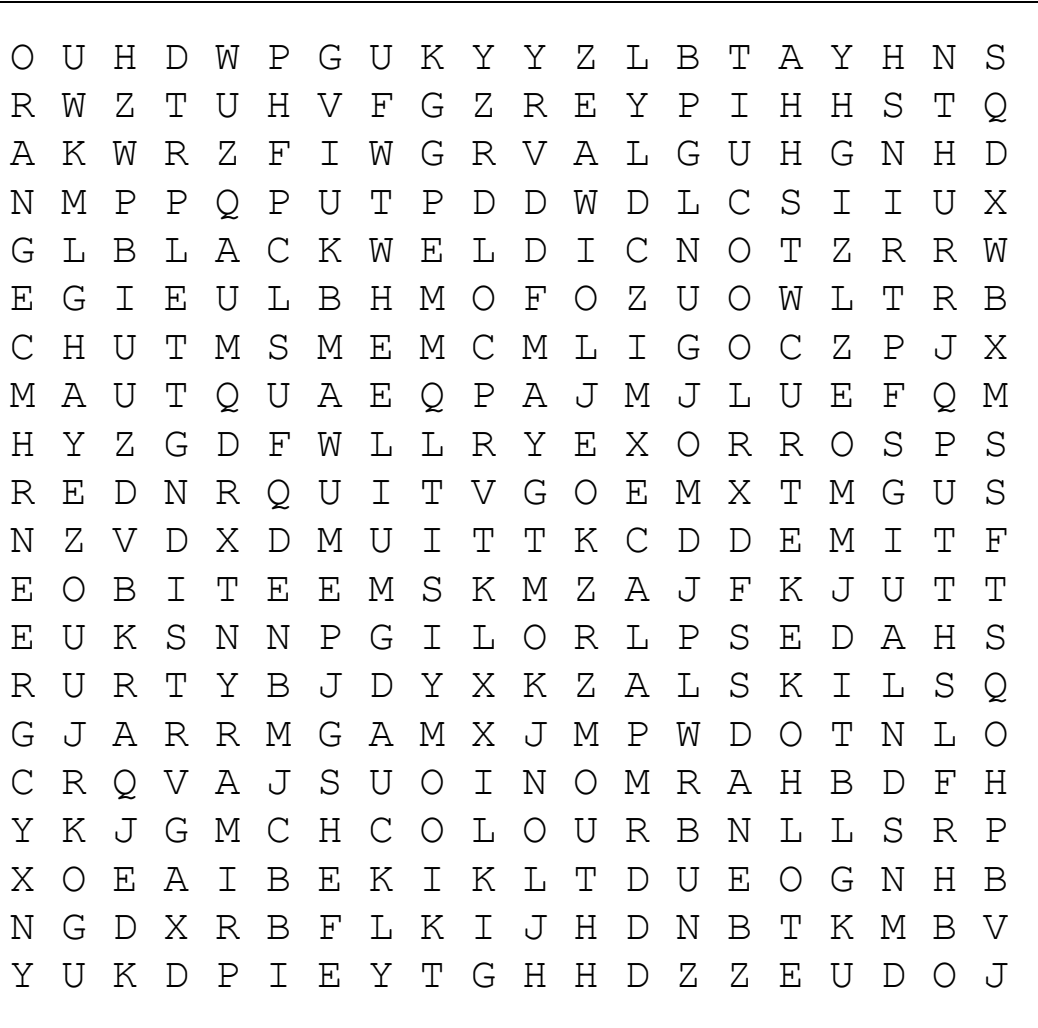
