Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you very much for all your support for us as a school this term. Home learning for Year 11 students

Should there be a need to use teacher assessment to inform final grades, it is essential that students do their home learning milestones over the holidays so that they are ready to evidence their considerable talent when it comes to the next assessment point. One of my most painful memories in teaching is seeing several students, unable to sit the summer exams due to COVID, who had the potential to do much better being left with low grades- due to their lack of effort earlier in the year- that ended up limiting their life paths. You can support your year 11 child over the holidays by checking that they are sticking to their revision timetable and achieving the learning milestones that Mr Billings has written to you about.
