Dear parents and pupils,

If hope that this issue of our weekly newsletter finds you all well and that you are coping with the demands of social distancing and lockdown as well as possible.

This week we have been working hard to get free school meals vouchers out to as many of our families as possible and to further develop the online learning resources on our MS Teams platform. We are aware that there have been some ongoing difficulties for some families in accessing or using the vouchers and will keep doing our best to make sure the system works for you. It is clear that it is a massive undertaking for the Department for Education and Edenred and demand has been such that their systems have struggled to cope. We are seeing signs that things are improving and the vouchers are getting through now but please do communicate any issues with us and we will do our very best to help.

As well as ensuring that our current Year 11 and 13 pupils' outcomes and progression routes are secured, our attention has also been on ensuring that robust plans are in place to enable other year groups to catch up when they return to school, especially the Year 10 and 12s, who will move into their 'exam year' in September.

We have also been working closely (online) with our colleagues from the primary schools to put in place an alternative to the usual 'early risers' programme.

With the news last Thursday that the lockdown has been extended for a further 3 weeks, hopefully we are now entering the final straight and can get back to as near to normal as can be achieved relatively soon!

I am extremely grateful for the efforts of all of our teachers in ensuring that distance learning is now fully up and running. It is really important that we make the most of the Summer term to ensure that pupils do not fall behind. I have been very impressed with the way that the overwhelming majority of pupils have adapted to these new ways of working and, with staff continuing to provide close support, the term does have the potential to be a very productive one.

To make sure that pupils' efforts are recognised, we will be continuing to celebrate all the fantastic work going on at home and look forward to hearing and sharing updates from you all throughout the term. I also fully recognise and appreciate the efforts being expended by our parents to make sure that the online learning is being accessed regularly-thank you for your continuing support in that respect.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to say a huge well done to those pupils from both Park and Springs who have continued to attend school. I have been keeping up to date with your activities over Twitter and have been really impressed with your enthusiasm and positivity as well as the quality of the things that you have been baking and making.

I am sure that you will have seen on the news that today (20th April) is the launch day of the 'Oak National Academy', which is a collaborative effort between our trust, United Learning and a number of the other large academies groups from across the country. The website can be accessed at

#### **Free School Meal Vouchers**

You will have gathered from the media that there have been a number of issues with the FSM voucher system coping with the demand from the country's schools.

We can confirm the following:

- Postal vouchers for the 2 weeks of the Easter holiday were posted on Friday 17th April to all of our eligible familes who opted for this method of delivery.
- Email vouchers for the 2 weeks of the Easter holiday have been 'released' online and are gradually being received by those families who opted for this method of delivery. We have been checking regularly and, although the website is very slow at times, we are reassured that all of our orders have been received and actioned.
- Following DfE advice, we have placed an order for 4 weeks'
  worth of vouchers in one submission; the status currently shows
  them "in progress". These will be released to our eligible families
  in due course.
