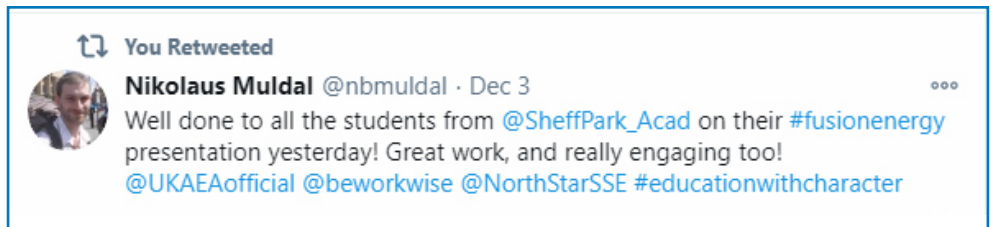


# North Star

# Sheffield South East VI Form

We believe that students need a wealth of opportunities and experiences to become confident, well-rounded and ambitious young adults. To support this, we hold regular events and representatives from Bentley helped to kick off a busy term for our VI Form students by hosting an online talk sharing their knowledge and experiences.

Students have also participated in talks and (virtual) visits with Iain Anderson, an ex-political advisor who spoke with Y12 Business students, Local MP, Paul Blomfield, and students enjoyed a week-long online programme called HEPPFEST which centred around HE and a careers and included talks from an ex Bluepeter presenter, a Googlebox TV star and a BBC Radio 1 DJ.

Sessions have also been held with Cambridge University and Oxford University which has resulted in four of our students applying to join their Target Oxbridge project. Students will find out in February if their applications have been successful.
