Riksa Amin and Reece Matthews are celebrating after receiving special honours at United Learning's national Secondary Best in Everyone Awards.

Riksa won the coveted Pupil of the Year Award in the Year 10-13 category, with Reece receiving the Drama Award.

The Best in Everyone Awards celebrate the exceptional achievements of students and staff at United Learning schools and academies across the country. They include awards for academic excellence, extracurricular achievements and for service to school communities.

Hundreds of nominations were received, which were then carefully considered by a judging panel, with Riksa

nominated by her teachers for the many ways in which she volunteers to help others. As well as volunteering in a primary school's homework club, she has run arts and craft activities at local historic site, Manor Lodge.

Along with other academy students, Riksa has participated in a Bag Pack at Tesco and raised over £400 for Weston Park Cancer Hospital. In addition to giving up her spare time to help others, she is very committed to her studies and is a role model to younger students, showing what can be achieved through hard work, determination and ambition.

Reece's nomination was on account of his dedication to drama and his many achievements. He took on many of the leading roles in the academy's extravaganza '24K Magic' and has worked with many of the academy's feeder schools to deliver inspiring drama workshops.

Riksa and Reece picked up their awards along with the other winners at a special ceremony held at Oxford Town Hall on Friday 29 June.

Commenting on her award, Riksa said: "I am really proud that I have won this amazing award. I didn't even know that this award existed and being nominated is just wonderful."

Pupils were in good company at the event, with attendees including dignitaries such as the Lord-Lieutenant of South Yorkshire, the High Sheriff of South Yorkshire, Gul Nawaz Hussain QC, the South Yorkshire Police and Crime Commissioner, the Chief Constable for South Yorkshire Police and a number of High Court Judges and politicians.

Two of our Year 10 pupils, Thomas and Riksa, were brave enough to stand up in front of all the dignitaries, parents and teachers at the event and deliver a speech about the programme and what it meant to them.

Other awards on the evening were presented to Riksa, who achieved the highest accolade of being a Gold Award Winner. Her fellow Year 10 pupil, Reece, received a Special Recognition award, acknowledging all the extra work he did to complete the award, while also having many commitments outside of school.

June saw the arrival of our annual Sports Day. Year 7 to Year 10 pupils took part in a fun packed day, organised by the PE department. The event was a little different this year - once pupils had participated in their athletics events, they were invited to tackle the inflatable assault course in a Form to Form competition.

Celebrations were in full swing at the Sheffield South East Learning Partnership (SSELP) Awards evening recently, where Sheffield Park Academy's Mrs Wright picked up the coveted Community Cohesion of the Year award.



Mrs Wright is an invaluable member of our team, working at the academy since its inception and at the predecessor school before that. Mrs Wright's deep knowledge of our pupils, families and community is the result of many years hard work, forging positive relationships with our stakeholders. Over her time at the school, hundreds of pupils have remained in education and gone on to achieve outstanding exam results due to the care and support she has given them.



Fundraising

We were extremely proud to present Weston Park Hospital Cancer Charity with a cheque for over £15,000 earlier this term. This was the single biggest donation they have ever received from a school!



The money was raised through a combination of activities including non-uniform days, a coast to coast staff cycle ride, a tuck shop – run once a week by a group of volunteer pupils, bake sales and a sponsored skydive which Executive Principal Mr Dillon, Assistant Principal Mr Wainwright and Interim Head of School Mr Hannan bravely undertook.



Fundraising

Previous attempts to complete the skydive had to be cancelled due to poor weather but April brought blue skies and the jump went ahead from an eye watering 15,000 feet.

After completing the skydive, Mr Dillon said: "It's something I've never done before, it was incredibly



daunting at first, but an amazing experience and all for a very worthwhile cause - one which is very close to the academies' collective heart. As part of our commitment to provide our pupils with an Education with Character, we work very closely with the local community, actively seeking to help those less fortunate than ourselves, whilst helping instill a sense of care and compassion in all of our students. We are delighted to be able to support the amazing work that Weston Park does and we would like to thank everyone who has donated and supported us throughout."
